



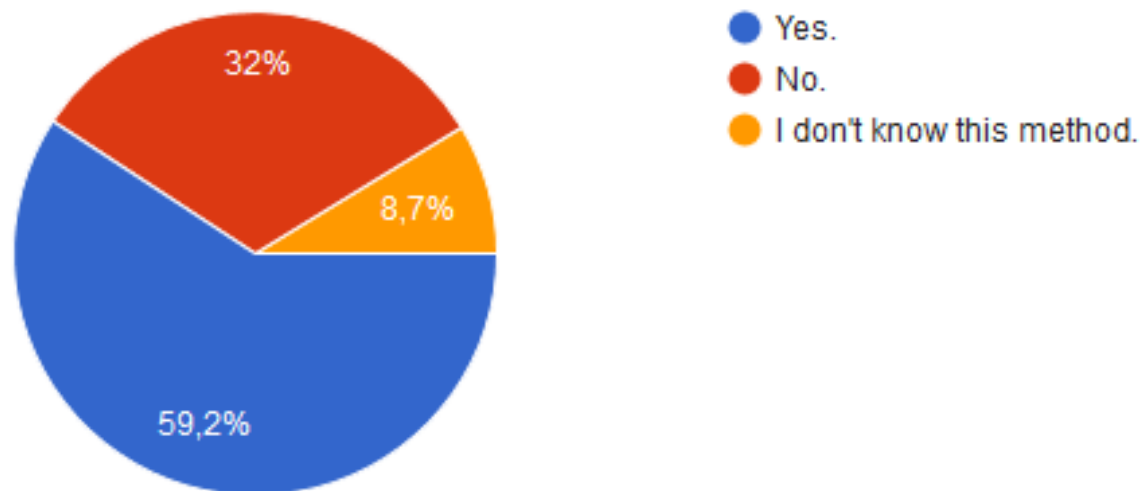

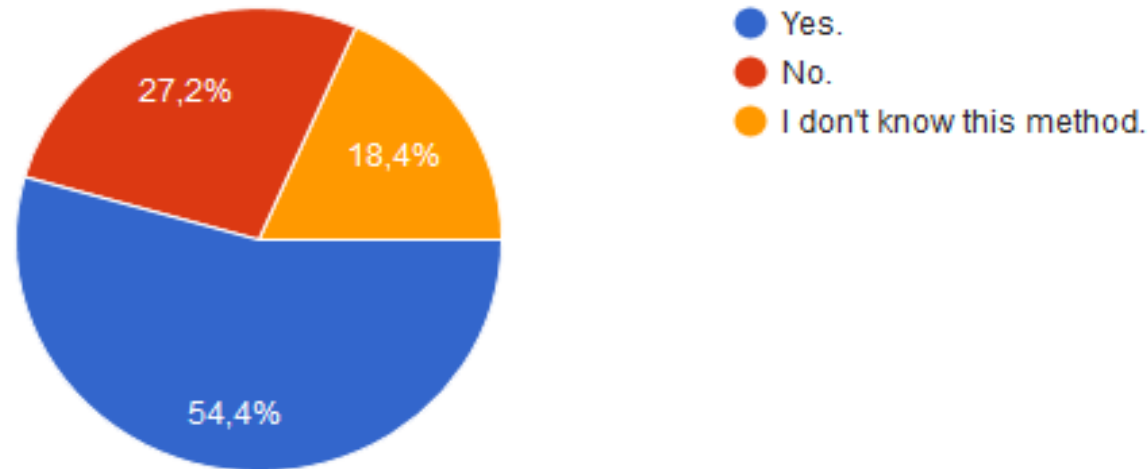
Cooperative learning - involves structuring classes around small groups that work together in such a way that each group member's success is dependent on the group's success.

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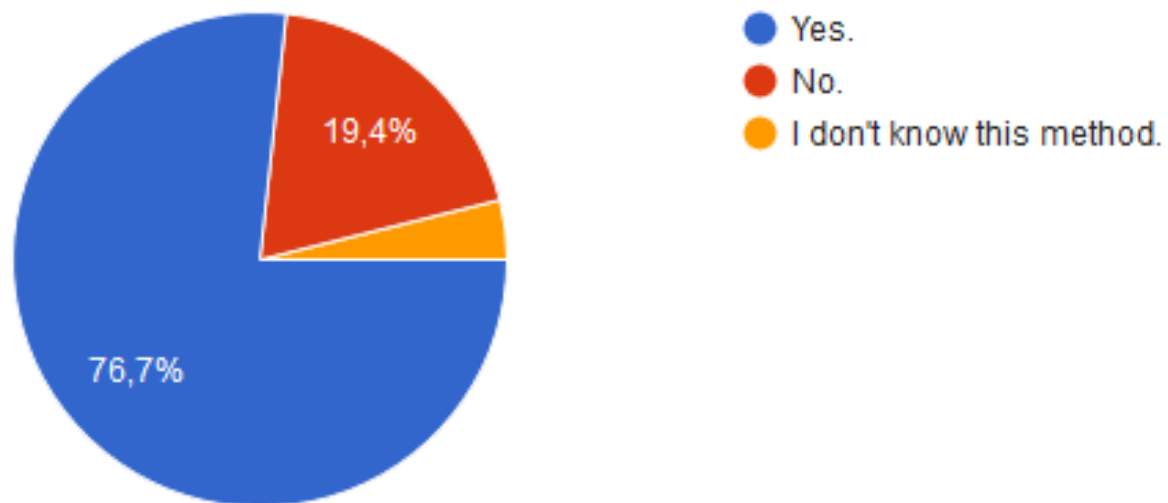
Flipped classroom - delivering instructional content outside of the classroom. It moves activities, including those that may have traditionally been considered homework, into the classroom while teacher being more of a guidance and a mentor.

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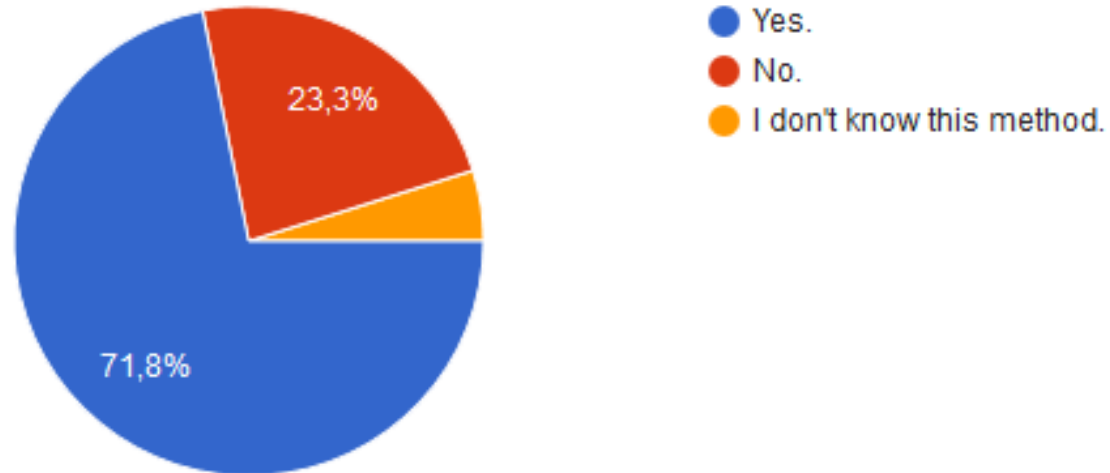
Gamification - the practice of making activities more like games in order to make them more interesting or enjoyable.

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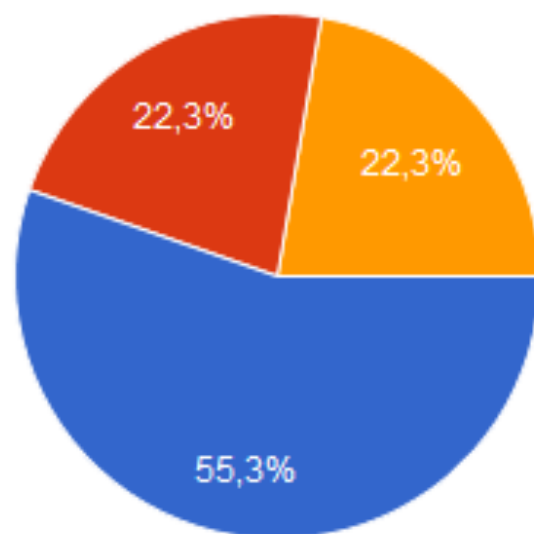
Mobile learning - education via the Internet or network using personal mobile devices, such as tablets and smartphones to obtain learning materials through mobile apps, social interactions and online educational hubs.

Less/meaningful homeworks, topics that are really important in later life

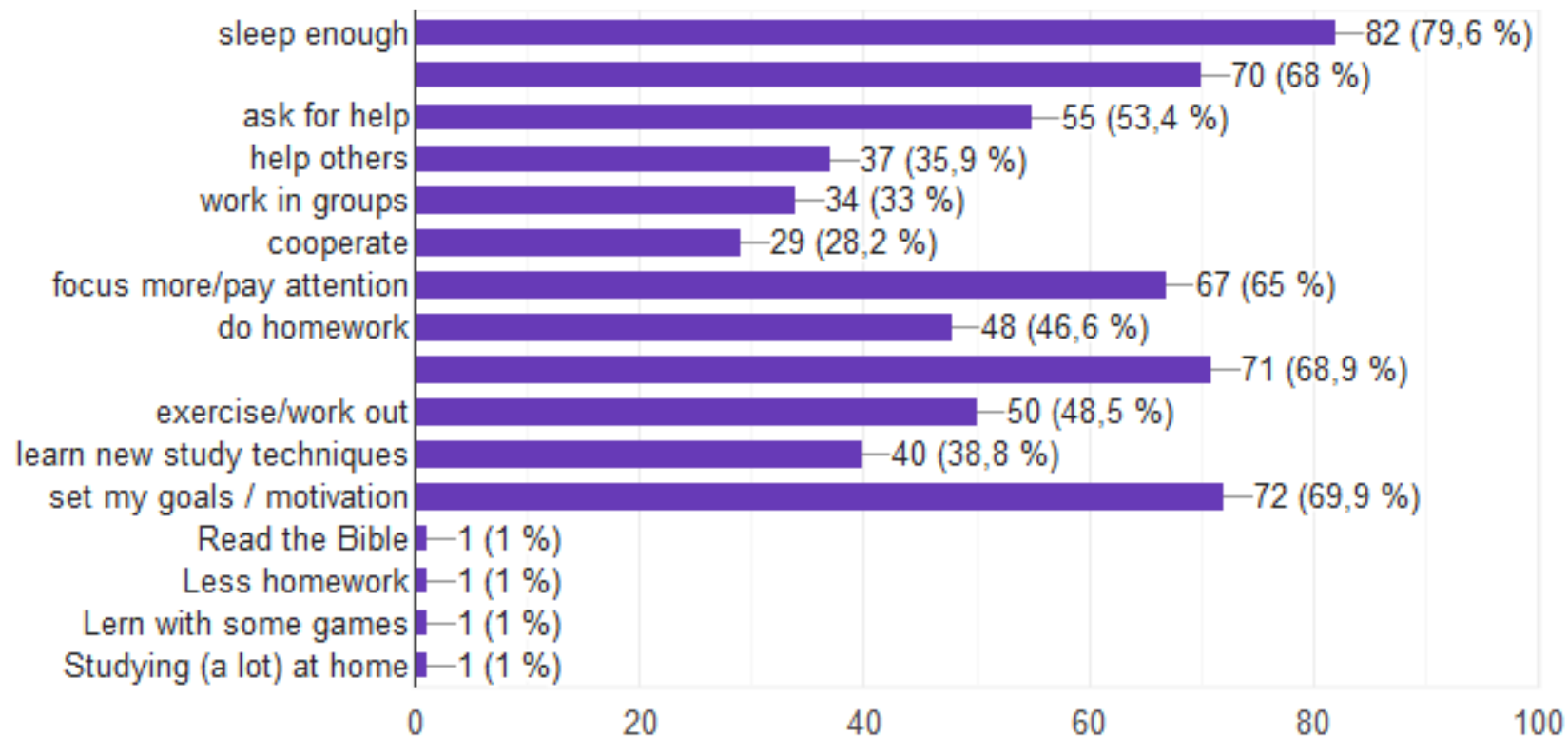
I think that the lessons we're doing right now, are pretty good. Maybe using technology like mobile phones etc.

They should focus on the mindset of the students more often. That would create a better connection between student and teacher.

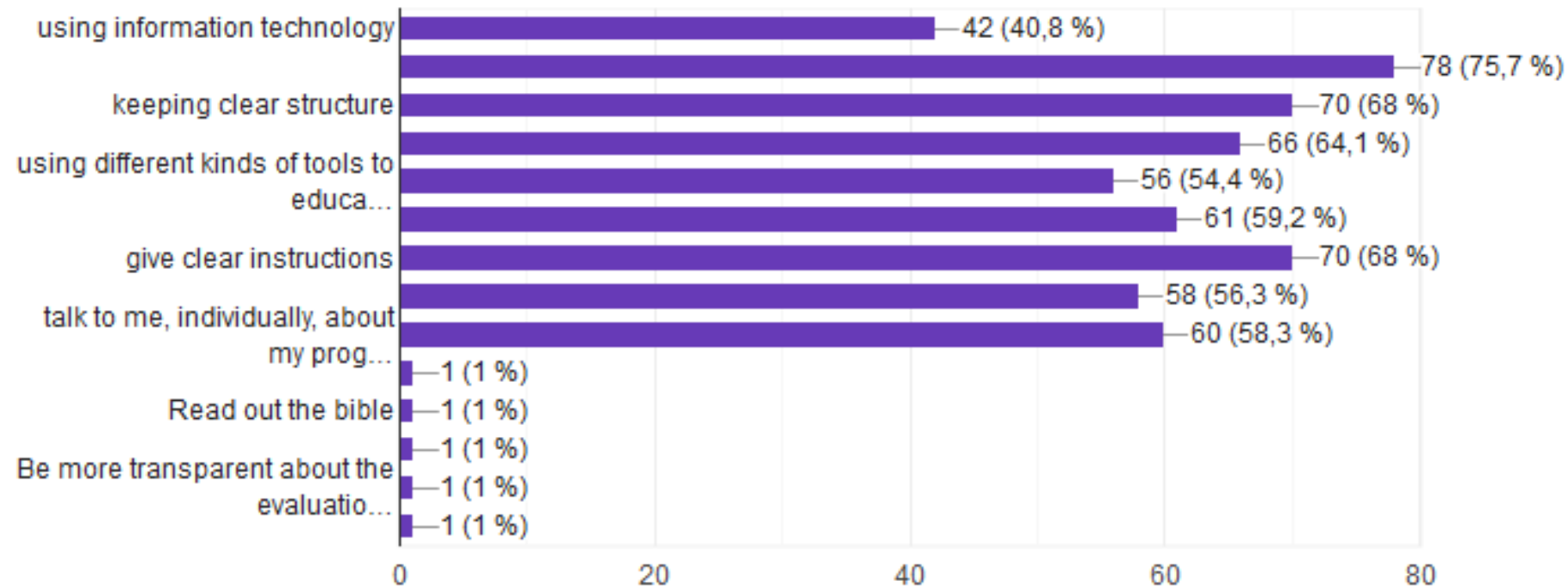

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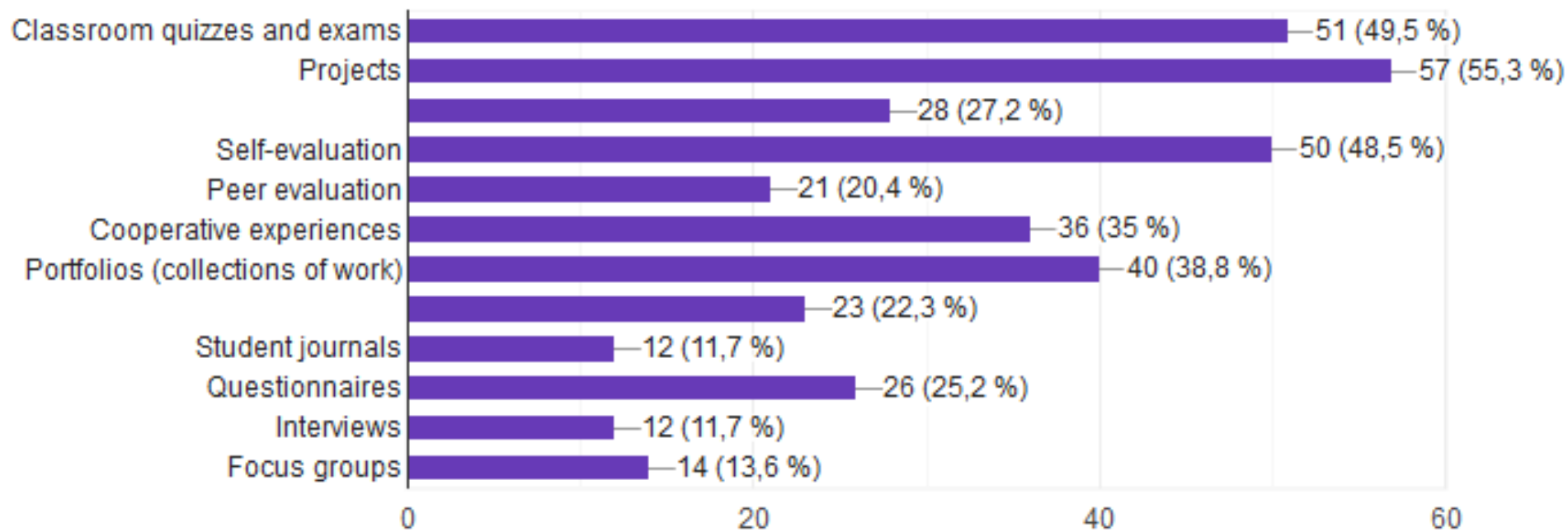
