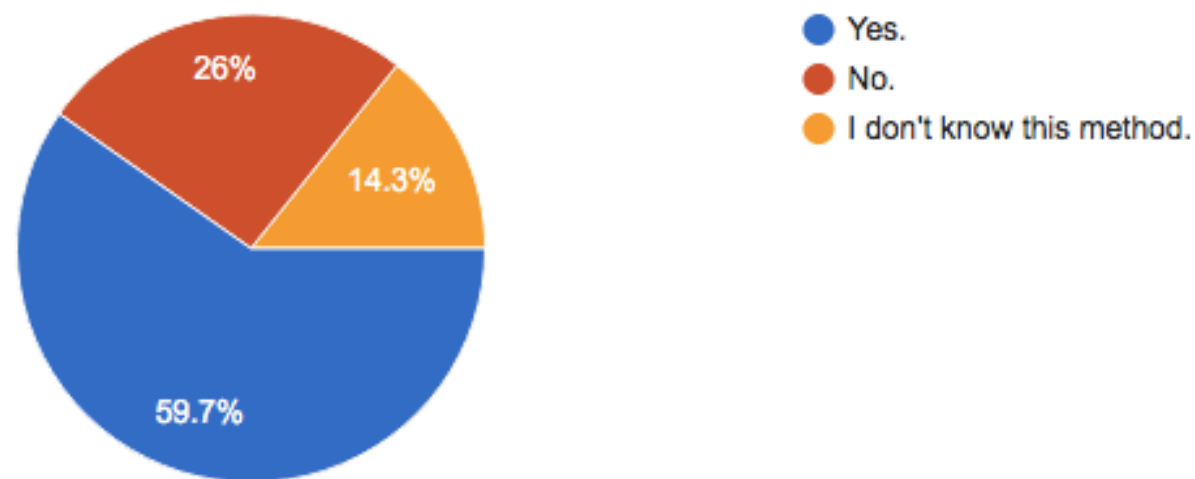
Improving teaching practices

Cooperative learning - involves structuring classes around small groups that work together in such a way that each group member's success is dependent on the group's success.



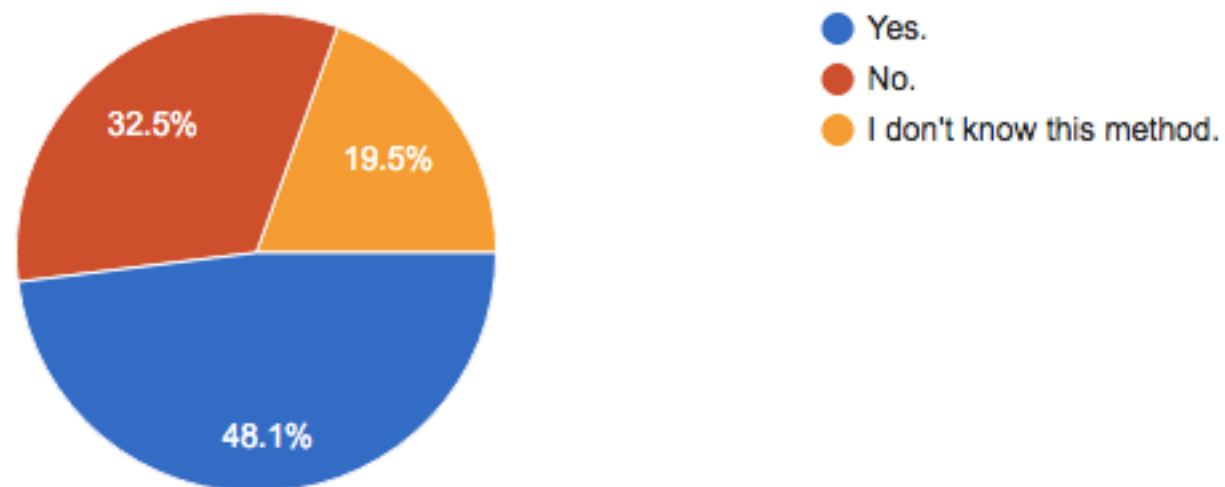

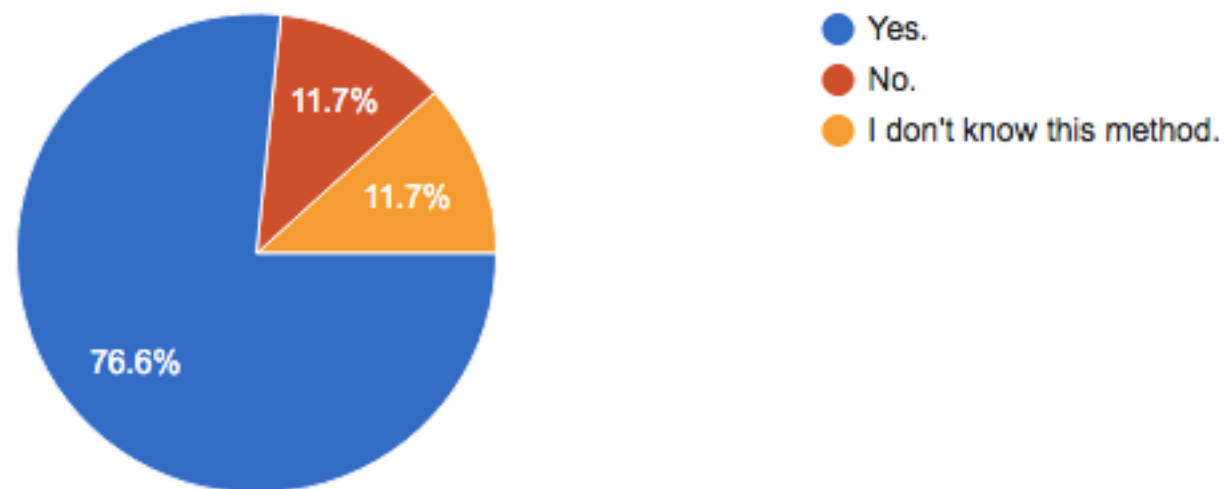

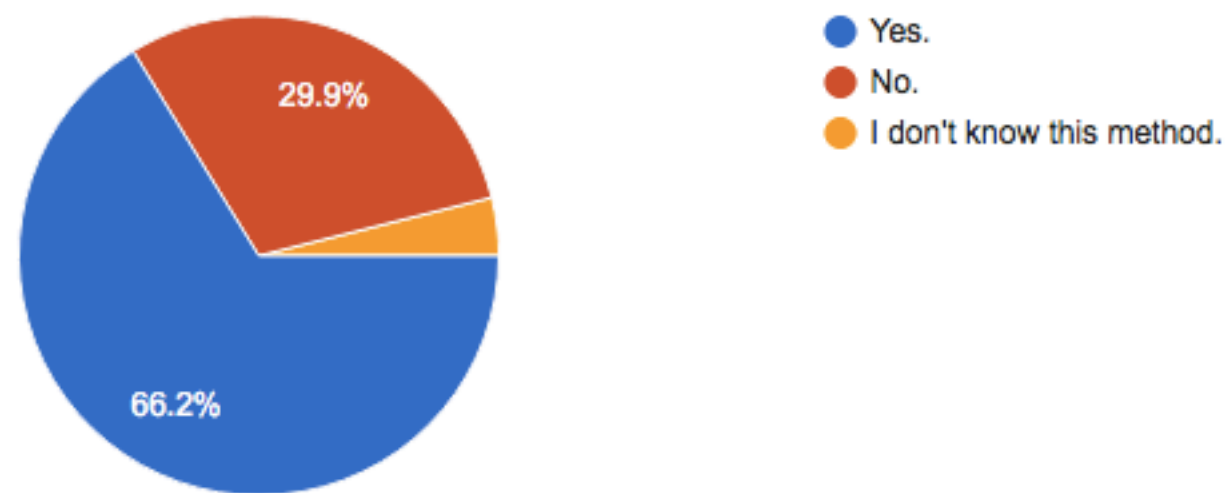
Gamification - the practice of making activities more like games in order to make them more interesting or enjoyable.

What could the school management do to contribute to better teaching/learning process?

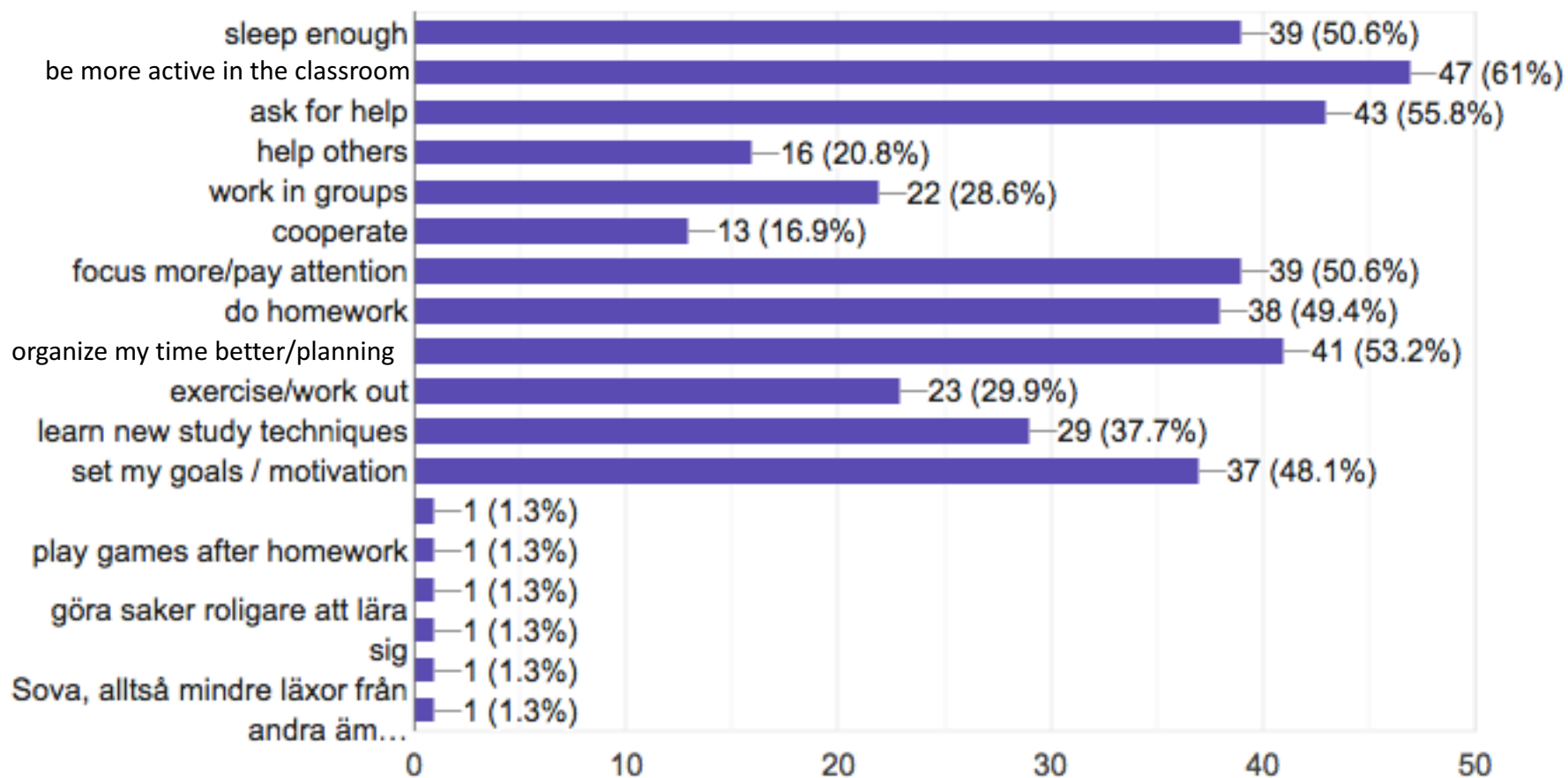
- 19 x I don't know, (I couldn't do it better)

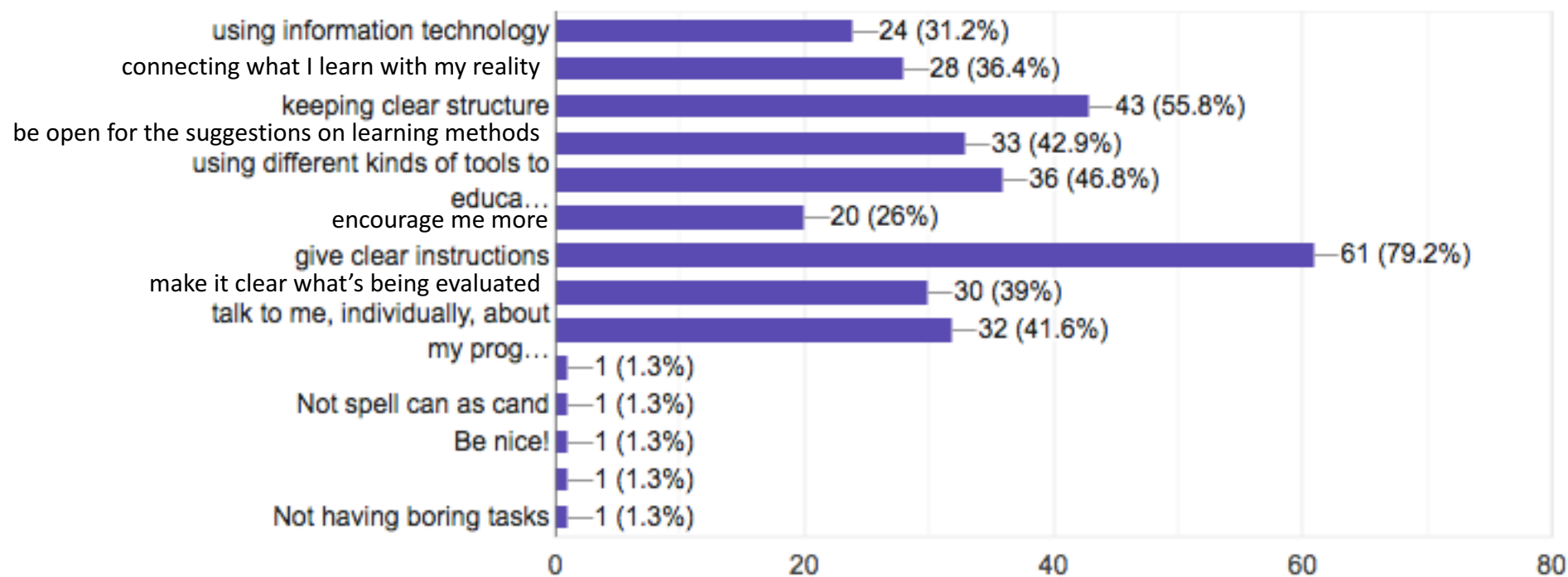
What can YOU do to improve your learning performance? (Mark all that apply to you.)
